Accessory Necessity

Oscar de la Renta's look is what fashion expert Pamela Burns considers a well-selected match of the season's metallics and neutrals, married in a "whimsical flash" of white. "[This runway outfit] is made clean with the belt," says Burns, a merchandiserturned-pro shopper of more than 18 years. "The belt shows how you can take a simple accessory and make all that it encompasses chic." And for no-room-to-fudge budgets, it's good to know these kinds of buckled centerpieces can be found at all different price points. "This is something that could be matched with a similar item from H&M, Bloomingdales or Nordstrom."

Jacket: Asamoah names ruffles "the number one trend" for buyer-friendliness. "They tend to take away layers and deceive the eye." In this design, the variety of angles in the sleeves is also in line with the pro-public theme. "The more vertical a design, the more restrictive."
